The Freedman's Savings and Trust Company, or the Freedman's Bank as it is universally called, was chartered on March 3, 1865, as an outgrowth of military saving banks which had been established elsewhere for Black Union troops who needed a place to deposit their wages and bounty money. Congress was persuaded to establish a bank so former slaves could learn the value of thrift and savings. In North Carolina, there were three branches of the Freedman's Bank. These were located in New Bern, Raleigh and Wilmington. Over 8,600 records of individual surnames survive. The majority are freedmen and their family members, but occasionally there are white depositors and church and social club deposits.

The book was funded by grants and donations from the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources, the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation, the New Hanover Friends of the Public Library, and Tabitha Hutaff McEachern.
