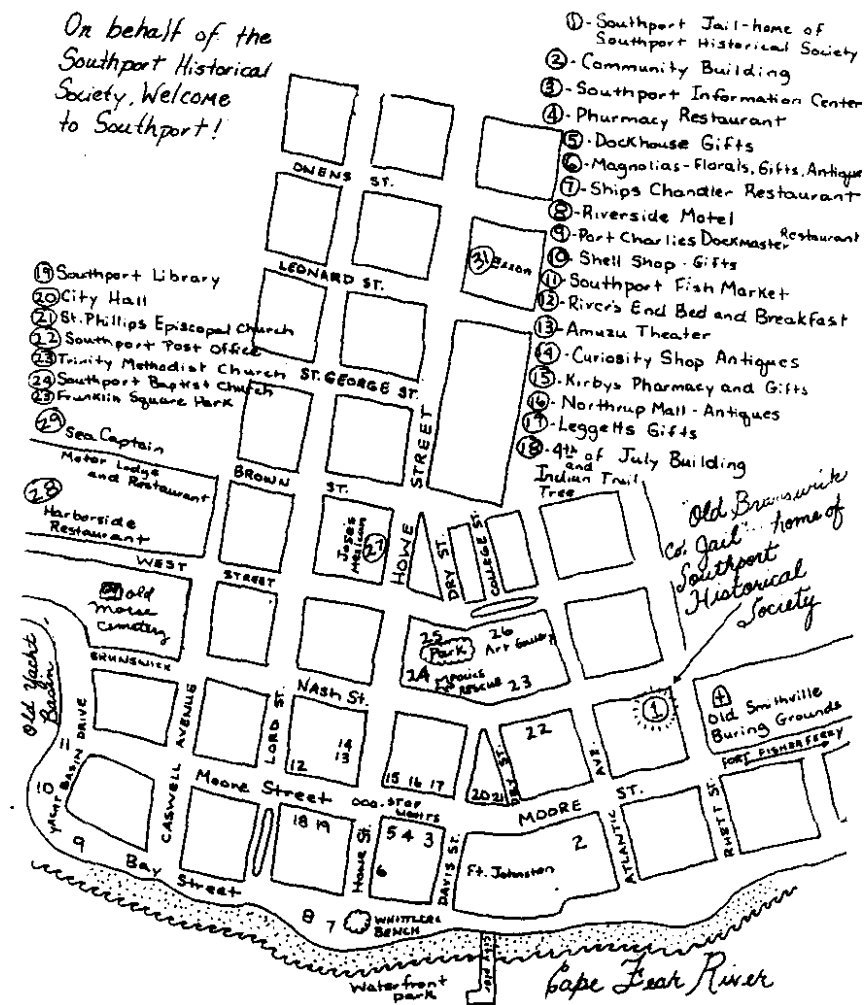

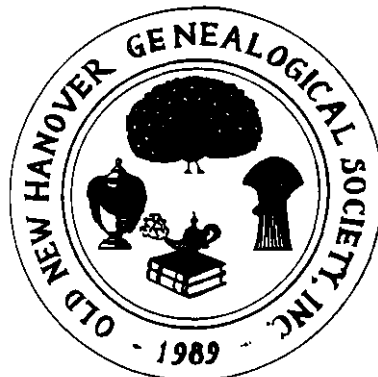

MEMBERSHIP NEWS

One of our members, Mrs. Regina Hines Ellison of Ocean Springs, Mississippi, recently sent us some very interesting clippings from her local newspaper, the Mississippi Press. Mrs. Ellison is a Certified Genealogical Record Searcher and also a Genealogy Columnist. She writes a genealogy column, Branches and Twigs, for two newspapers on the Mississippi Gulf Coast.

From the April 20, 1988, Mississippi Press she sent the following:

Old Tombstones

Mrs. Marie Martin, 11213 Moorman Road, Pascagoula found two old, blackened tombstones at an old cemetery on the Pearl River between Interstate 10 and Pearlinton recently. She cleaned them until she could make out the inscription. She sent us the information, in case someone might be interested. One tombstone read "Amelia Gause, native of Wilmington, N. C., born May 1, 1814, died 1886." The other read: "Eugene, 15 years ... days."

Tombstone Connection

About a month ago, this column ran a note from Marie Martin, who found two blackened tombstones on the Pearl River between Interstate 10 and Pearlinton. A local family member, Katherine Bowen Fant, of Gulfport, has told us that the tombstones were those of Amelia Potter Russ Gause, who came with her family by wagon train, from Shallotte, N. C., into Mississippi in 1836, and her grandson, Eugene. Amelia married Wesley Coke Asbury Daugherty Gause, who was a part of the wagon train.

Some of the North Carolinians stayed on the east bank of the Pearl River. Others crossed the river and settled in Louisiana. The bodies were buried in Gainesville and a group of Russ-Gause families. But when NASA was being built, the government moved the graves and apparently set aside the tombstones.

We want to thank Mrs. Regina Hines Ellison for sending us this information.

Our May Meeting at Sloop Point Plantation, home of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Graves, was a quite a success. We found that besides an interest in genealogy, our members apparently are accomplished cooks. Mrs. Graves presented a complete history on her home and graciously allowed us to wander through the home and grounds at our leisure. 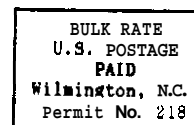
VOLUNTEERS NEEDED
